To make Tennis Sydney an example to those who need one, that sexuality does not determine sporting prowess.

And whilst we have many lesbian icons in the sport, instead of waiting for there to be a gay icon that we can look up to, maybe we can be a LGBT club that will inspire more LGBT players to come out.

Instead of us looking to them, maybe we can be what they are looking for.
